2007 Pulitzer Prize

In a novel set in an indefinite, futuristic, post-apocalyptic world, a father and his young son make their way through the ruins of a devastated American landscape, struggling to survive and preserve the last remnants of their own humanity.

2006 National Book Award

After a near-fatal car accident, Mark Schluter's sister reluctantly returns to nurse him back from a traumatic head injury. A mysterious disease, combined with the strange circumstances surrounding Mark's accident, threatens to change their lives beyond recognition.
