

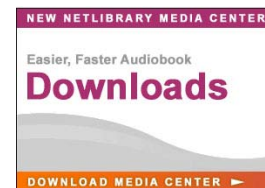
# Want to download



# and read books online from home?

- 1 Go to our website:  
<http://www.laketravislibrary.org/>
- 2 Click the red **My Account** link to login with your library card number and phone number.
- 3 Scroll down and click on the **NetLibrary** link with the eAudiobooks logo. You may be redirected.
- 4 Browse NetLibrary's catalog of over 190,000 publicly accessible books available online!
- 5 Read electronic books on your web browser and navigate using the contents.
- 6 To download audio books, click on **eAudiobooks** on the right hand side of the page and browse the titles. (See other side for information about the Media Center.)
- 7 When you find an audio book you want, click on **Download this eAudiobook**, then click **Checkout & Download CD Quality**.
- 8 You will be prompted to create a username and password. This can be anything you want and **is not** associated with your library username and password.
- 9 The audio file will begin downloading. Save the file to your computer rather than opening the file.
- 10 Play the file on your computer or transfer it to a portable media device.

## NetLibrary Media Center



NetLibrary has developed new software to help users download and manage their eAudiobooks. If you have a PC with Windows XP or Vista (32-bit), you can download the NetLibrary Media Center which is a separate application that runs on your computer. Instructions are available at <http://www.netlibrary.com/MediaCenter/Intro.aspx>. Just click **Download Media Center** and NetLibrary will guide you through installation and use of this new tool!

### Tips

- NetLibrary audio book files come in wma (windows media audio) and mp3 format.
- For iTunes, download the file in mp3 format and import the file as a new album.

- If the transferred file doesn't play, try opening it once on your computer to make sure the license is activated.
